



Pat Parkinson is a Senior Fellow at the Bank Policy Institute. He worked 31 years at the Federal Reserve Board before retiring in 2012. He was Director of the Board's Division of Banking Supervision and Regulation from 2009 to 2011 and earlier was Deputy Director of the Board's Division of Research and Statistics. During the first half of 2009, Pat was counselor to Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner and played a leading role in development of proposals for reforming financial institutions and markets, including a comprehensive regulatory framework for the OTC derivatives markets. In 2021-2022 he served as Project Director for the Group of Thirty's work on enhancing the resilience of the U.S. Treasury markets.

Pat earned a Ph.D. in Economics at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, an M.A. in Economics at Northwestern University and a B.A. in Psychology at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.
