

First Vice Presidents

The Banking Act of 1935 changed the position of governor of the Reserve Bank to president of the Reserve Bank, and it was at this time that the deputy governor of the Reserve Bank was renamed first vice president. As of 2021, there have been twelve first vice presidents of the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland.

The information included below was compiled from the Bank's annual reports. Each annual report lists the first vice president as of the end of that year. If the occupant of the position changed during the course of the year, the date of the change is not always noted in the report and thus would not be noted here.
